I have only been on the FCC board for a year but what a year it's been! One of the most memorable events is our campaign against a government plan to restrict public access to company directors' information. I was closely involved in setting up meetings with the Financial Services and the Treasury Bureau and with the Privacy Commissioner, who also gave a lunch talk and took questions at the club last month. I also represented the FCC in a joint press conference to publicise journalists' concerns about the proposal. The government has just decided to postpone the rule change indefinitely, which is encouraging, though we should continue to press for a full withdrawal.

As a member of the Professional Committee, I've had a chance to help organise and host club events on a variety of subjects, including a spirited debate by a panel of legislative council candidates. It has also been a great honour to help judge the annual Human Rights Press Awards.

I am seeking re-election because I would like to help the Club continue its role monitoring threats to the free press. I also want to carry on my work with the Professional Committee, and squeeze in a complaint about the constricted women's W.C.!

Brief biography:

Enid Tsui recently left the Financial Times to launch a freelance career in radio and print. She was previously the Hong Kong correspondent of the FT, where she held a number of roles in Hong Kong and London for 10 years. She is also the former editor-in-chief of CFO China, the Economist Group's first non-English language publication. She got her first real taste of journalism when she worked part-time at the SCMP's Sunday Magazine while she was an arts faculty undergraduate at HKU many years ago.
