In Constitutional, I shall aim to enhance governance and keep our Club straight. My brief background: Before becoming an independent public affairs consultant offering bespoke research and due diligence service, I had spent more than two decades working in many local newsrooms including *Apple Daily*, *Hong Kong Economic Journal*, *Sing Tao Daily*, and the *South China Morning Post*, in various editorial and managerial capacities. Elected as chairman of the Hong Kong Journalists Association in 1998, I also served as a Journalist Governor on our Board for a few years after the handover and continue to serve as a judge of the SOPA Awards. I am the editor of a book titled *My First Trip to China*. Hong Kong is my home and I am here to stay. And I want to make sure that the FCC, the only club I belong to, is here to stay, too.
